

FALL 1996 OSU STUDENT PROFILE DATA AND TREND HIGHLIGHTS

GENERAL

- Stillwater campus enrollment is up for the second year in a row; we are at 80% of our high point that was reached in 1982.
- While OSU's Fall 1996 total enrollment increased by 0.4% from Fall 1995, the state system enrollment decreased by 3.3%.
- Five-year enrollment trends from Fall 1991 to Fall 1996: new freshmen are up 12.7% and graduate enrollment is up 5%.
- First-year retention figures for full-time new freshmen (77.3%) and new transfers (71.6%) are up for the Fall 1995 class.
- The percentage of the 1990 beginning freshman class graduating after 6 years increased from 45.9% to 48.7% over the 1986 beginning freshman class.
- OSU's market share of Oklahoma ACT test-takers decreased slightly from 1995's new freshman class, from 9.1% to 9.0%.
- OSU's percentage share of the total state system headcount enrollment in Oklahoma's institutions of higher education increased for the second year in a row, from 11.5% in 1995 to 11.9% in 1996.
- Counting all students (undergraduate and graduate), once again, all 77 counties in Oklahoma, all 50 states, and 105 foreign countries are represented among OSU's student body.
- Projections for the number of Oklahoma high school Spring 1996 graduates were revised downward this past spring. The decrease in resident high school graduates, together with higher admission standards, resulted in a slight drop in Oklahoma resident new freshmen (2,056 this year vs. 2,090 last year). Oklahoma high school graduates are again predicted to rise beginning in 1997 through the year 2000, peaking at an increase of 15.6% above the Spring 1996 totals.

STUDENT BODY

Source of Students

- Total resident new freshmen increased 11.4% from Fall 1991 to Fall 1996.
- Total resident new transfers increased 12.6% from Fall 1995 to Fall 1996.
- In Fall 1996, Stillwater High School again provided twice as many new freshmen as the next highest feeder school (129 students). Jenks High School was the next highest feeder school this year and in 1995 (60 students both years). In the three years before (1994, 1993, and 1992), Edmond Memorial High School sent the second highest number of new freshmen (79, 73, 108 students, respectively).

- OSU continues to draw new freshmen heavily from the six surrounding states. In Fall 1996, OSU had 205 students from these six states. This number was 8.4% of all new freshmen and 53% of all out-ofstate new freshmen.
- Fall 1996 out-of-state new freshmen increased 3.2% from Fall 1995 (from 374 to 386).
- Nonresident undergraduates increased 6.4% from Fall 1995 to Fall 1996 and that reflects continued growth in the proportion of out-of-state undergraduate students.

Composition of Student Body

- The total number of graduate students increased 2.3% from Fall 1991 to Fall 1996.
- The percentage of minority students has risen for eight straight years, increasing to 22.4% of the student body this fall.
- Native Americans comprise 7.3% of OSU undergraduates and 6.4% of the entire student body. They
 also received 5% of the degrees granted in the 1995-96 academic year.
- The ethnic makeup of OSU's total enrollment from Fall 1995 to Fall 1996:
 - a significant increase in the number of Native American and Hispanic students (13.4% and 7.1%, respectively)
 - ♦ African-American and White students increased slightly (0.9% and 0.2%, respectively)
 - ♦ Asian and International students showed a slight decrease (-2.9% and -0.1%, respectively).
- The ethnic makeup of OSU's total enrollment from Fall 1991 to Fall 1996:
 - a significant increase in the number of Native American (47%), Hispanic (37%), International (26%), and Asian (10%) students
 - White and African-American students showed a slight decrease (-7% and -4%, respectively).
- Out-of-state enrollment has increased 7.5% since Fall 1995 and 58% since Fall 1991.
- International student enrollment has stayed at or above 10% for 3 years in a row.
- OSU maintained the same percentage of male and female enrollment in Fall 1996 as in Fall 1995:
 54.2% male, 45.6% female.
- Enrollment of adult students (i.e., students age 23 and over) has increased 3% since Fall 1991 (from 7,259 to 7,477).
- OSU students borrowed 105% more money in the 1995-96 academic year than they did 5 years previously, while grants and other forms of nondebt financial aid increased only 16%.

COLLEGE

- College enrollment trends from Fall 1995 to Fall 1996:
 - ♦ Only HES showed an increase in undergraduate and graduate enrollment.
 - ♦ Five colleges (ASNR, CBA, CEAT, HES, and Vet Med) showed total enrollment increases.
 - ♦ Three colleges (ASNR, CEAT, and HES) showed undergraduate enrollment increases.
 - Four colleges (CBA, COE, HES, and Vet Med) showed graduate enrollment increases.
- College enrollment trends from Fall 1991 to Fall 1996:
 - ♦ Only ASNR showed an increase in undergraduate and graduate enrollment.
 - ♦ Four colleges (ASNR, A&S, HES, and Vet Med) showed total enrollment increases.
 - Three colleges (ASNR, A&S, and CEAT) showed undergraduate enrollment increases.
 - Four colleges (ASNR, CBA, HES, and Vet Med) showed graduate enrollment increases.

ACADEMIC

- The average ACT composite for all new freshmen increased from 23.8 in 1995 to 23.9 in Fall 1996.
- 80.2% of new freshmen reporting an ACT score had a composite of 21 or above; 72.1% had a composite of 22 or above.
- In Fall 1996, ACT subscore averages are up over Fall 1995 for Natural Science (23.8) and English (23.6), while Mathematics (22.6) and Reading (24.9) subscore averages remained the same.
- Females have continued to close the gap between male and female ACT average composite scores: from 1.1 in 1991 to 0.5 in 1996.
- The Fall 1996 average composite ACT score for new freshmen increased from Fall 1995 for ASNR,
 A&S, Education, the Division of Technology, and Human Environmental Sciences.
- ♦ 66.5% of new freshmen reporting their high school rank were in the top 30% of their class; 87.2% were in the top half
- ♦ The average high school GPA for new freshmen continues to climb: the 1996 average high school GPA is now 3.46, with 55% of new freshmen reporting a high school GPA of 3.6 or above.
- Engineering and Architecture students continue to have the highest overall cumulative GPA (2.97) and the highest composite ACT scores for new freshmen (26.51) of all OSU colleges. College of Education graduate students maintained the highest average cumulative GPA at 3.73.
- Asian students had the highest average cumulative undergraduate GPA (2.87). At the graduate level, Whites had the highest (3.68).
- This year's alternative admissions class has an average high school GPA of 3.0, an average high school percentile rank of 46%, and an average ACT composite score of 18.9. Five years ago, our alternative admissions class had an average high school GPA of 2.6, an average high school percentile of 51%, and an average ACT composite score of 19.3.

- Applications to OSU increased 4% from Fall 1995 to Fall 1996 but a slight decrease in percentage were accepted (88.5% in 1995, 87.5% in 1996).
- ◆ The percentage of accepted students who actually enrolled decreased from 58.9% in Fall 1995 to 56.9% in Fall 1996.

DEGREES

- In the granting of Bachelor's degrees, all colleges except the College of Education awarded as many or more degrees in 1995-96 as in 1994-95.
- However, the most Bachelor's degrees were again awarded in Curriculum & Instruction.
- ◆ In the awarding of Master's degrees, two colleges awarded more in 1995-96 than in 1994-95: A&S (4.7% increase) and COE (12.5% increase).
- In the granting of Doctoral degrees, the university awarded 208 in 1995-96; this represents a 33% increase over 1994-95.
- Women are being awarded a greater number of all degrees. In 1995-96, women were awarded 96 more degrees than in 1994-95 (from 1,572 to 1,668); this represents a 6% increase in the total number of degrees awarded to women.
- Compared to 1994-95, the percentage of degrees granted to women:
 - ♦ Bachelor's degrees increased slightly (from 46.2% to 46.7%)
 - ♦ Masters degrees increased slightly (from 38.4% to 40%)
 - ♦ Doctoral degrees remained the same (at 40%)
 - All degrees increased slightly (from 44.5 to 45.1%)
- ♦ International students received 15% of all degrees granted in 1995-96, while Native Americans received 5%, Asians received 2%, African Americans received 2%, and Hispanics received 1%. These percentages showed little change from the 1994-95 academic year.


LOCATION OF TOTAL STUDENT ENROLLMENT OKLAHOMA STATE UNIVERSITY

















RESIDENT GRADUATE STUDENTS BY COUNTY










MAIN CAMPUS ENROLLMENT OKLAHOMA STATE UNIVERSITY FALL SEMESTERS 1976 THROUGH 1996









OKLAHOMA STATE UNIVERSITY FALL SEMESTERS 1985 THROUGH 1996


































OKLAHOMA STATE UNIVERSITY FALL SEMESTER HEADCOUNT ENROLLMENT AND PROJECTIONS

Enrollment at Oklahoma State University continued its upward climb in Fall 1996, due in large part to continued matriculation by last year's record-setting freshman class. In the past, the new student category has been the best source for increased enrollment. Sources for new students on campus include new freshmen, new graduate students, new transfer students, and readmitted students. This fall, OSU had 2,442 new freshmen, 1,069 new graduate students, 1,209 new undergraduate transfers, and 475 readmitted undergraduate students. The projections in this section are mathematical models based on these and other past performances. No attempt has been made to capture any of the "intangibles" which might attract students to the campus.

The new freshman enrollment for Fall 1996 is composed of 84.2% Oklahoma residents. This percentage share is characteristic of the freshman classes enrolling in this decade. Forecasts for Oklahoma high school graduates show increasing numbers through the end of the millenium, so the percentage of Oklahoma residents in future freshmen classes should account for an increasing share of each new freshman class. The forecasts of Oklahoma high school graduates used in this section are based upon information from the Oklahoma State Department of Education and the State Regents for Higher Education. It assumes that demographic trends such as immigration into and emigration out of the state will remain relatively constant.

In summary, several factors complicate enrollment projections at OSU. Some of these factors depend on policy decisions originating with the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and some depend on recruitment policies set by OSU administration. The impact of any new initiatives as well as changing admissions, enrollment, retention, scholarship, and recruiting policies will require the passage of some time in order for their effect to be reflected in the data used as a basis for enrollment projections.





GLOSSARY

Age

A student's age is computed by subtracting year of birth from 1995. Therefore, students born in January 1972 and December 1972 will both be reported as age 24 (1996-1972).

Classification

Classification describes the student level and/or type and includes freshman, sophomore, junior, senior, special undergraduate, special graduate, master, and doctorate.

<u>College</u>

The University is divided into six undergraduate colleges: Agricultural Sciences & Natural Resources (ASNR); Arts and Sciences (A&S); Business Administration (CBA); Education (COE); Engineering, Architecture, and Technology (CEAT); and Human Environmental Sciences (HES). Data for CEAT are sometimes divided into two data sets--one for Engineering & Architecture (ENGR), and the second for the Division of Technology (TECH).

In addition to these six undergraduate colleges, students may enroll in the University Academic Services, the Graduate College, and the College of Veterinary Medicine. In this report, students enrolled in the Graduate College are usually distributed for reporting purposes to the respective undergraduate college which administers their major coursework.

Ethnicity Codes and Definitions

For purposes of reporting OSU enrollment by ethnicity, the total enrollment at OSU <u>excluding</u> internationals (non-U.S. citizens) is divided into the following categories:

White:

All persons having <u>origins</u> in any of the <u>original</u> peoples of Europe (except Spain and Portugal), North Africa (above the Sahara), or the Middle East. This category would include, for instance: Italy, France, the British Isles, Scandinavia, Germany, Russia, Romania, Greece, Turkey, Morocco, Algeria, Libya, Egypt, Iraq, Israel, Saudi Arabia, and Iran.

African American:

All persons having <u>origins</u> in any of the <u>original</u> peoples of Africa south of the Sahara.

Native American:

All persons having origins in any of the original peoples of North or South

America.

Hispanic:

All persons having <u>origins</u> in any of the <u>original</u> peoples of Spain or Portugal. This category would generally include, for instance: Chicanos, Mexican-Americans, Mexicans, Central and South Americans, Cubans,

Puerto Ricans, Spaniards, and Portuguese.

Asian:

All persons having <u>origins</u> in any of the <u>original</u> peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Pacific Islands. This category would include, for instance: China, Japan, Korea, Thailand, Vietnam, the Philippines, Samoa, Indonesia, New Zealand, Australia, and the Indian subcontinent which includes all persons from Afghanistan, Nepal, Burma, India, and Pakistan.

In order to present a set of data regarding OSU enrollment which sums to OSU's total enrollment (<u>including</u> international students), some tables and figures which present data by ethnicity in this report include an additional column or row of data pertaining to the balance of the student body--the international student population.

Resident Status

A student is categorized as a resident if he or she was a legal resident of the State of Oklahoma at the time of original admission to OSU. If not a legal resident of Oklahoma at the time of admission, the student is a nonresident. If the student was a legal resident of a country other than the United States at the time of admission, the student is categorized as an international.

Retention

Student retention is usually expressed as a percentage figure which is derived by comparing the size of a specific group of students who were enrolled at OSU for a given semester to the size of the same group when they are enrolled for a successive given semester.

A non-returning student is defined as a student who was enrolled at OSU for a given semester and who did not graduate and who did not return to OSU for a successive given semester.

Special Undergraduate/Graduate Student

A special undergraduate student is a non-degree seeking student who has not earned a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university. A special graduate student is a non-degree seeking student admitted to the Graduate College.

Student Location

Beginning with the Fall Semester 1983, every student on the Student Master File was defined by one of the following Student Location Codes:

- 0 Enrolled only in courses on the OSU main campus (OSU)
- 1 Enrolled in courses on the OSU main campus and also taking courses at the University Center at Tulsa (OSU + UCT)
- 2 Enrolled in OSU courses only offered at the University Center at Tulsa (UCT)

For purposes of reporting data, students are reported as UCT students only if they are enrolled in OSU courses exclusively at the University Center at Tulsa (2 above). If a student is enrolled in a course on the OSU main campus, he or she is reported as a "main campus" student, irrespective of whether that student is also enrolled at the University Center at Tulsa (0 and 1 above).

Type of Admission

A new student admitted to OSU is classified as a new freshman, a transfer student, or a readmission. All other students are classified as returning students. A transfer student is classified as such only for the first semester that he attends OSU; after one semester a transfer student is reclassified as a returning student. Similarly, new freshmen are reclassified as returning students after their first semester at OSU (and are sometimes shown as "other freshmen" when presenting data by classification). A readmission student is a student who has enrolled at OSU in the past but who has not been enrolled at OSU during the previous semester (excluding the summer semester).

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
