







RESIDENT NEW FRESHMEN BY COUNTY













































AVERAGE CUMULATIVE GRADE POINT AVERAGE OF UNIVERSITY ACADEMIC SERVICES STUDENTS





OKLAHOMA STATE UNIVERSITY FALL 2003





ENROLLMENT PROJECTIONS

OKLAHOMA STATE UNIVERSITY FALL SEMESTER HEADCOUNT ENROLLMENT AND PROJECTIONS

Enrollment at Oklahoma State University increased in Fall 2003 over the previous year by 579 students. Undergraduate retention rates have improved significantly in the 1990's and will continue to have a large impact on enrollment numbers. The addition of OSU-Tulsa and new programs offered in Tulsa will also have a positive impact on overall enrollment in the coming years. The projections in this section are mathematical models based on past enrollments, retention rates, and forecasts of high school graduates.

Forecasts for Oklahoma high school graduates show numbers reflecting an overall decrease throughout the next 5 years. Since the OSU freshman class averages about 80% Oklahoma residents, these forecasts are the primary source of projection numbers for freshman enrollment. The forecasts of Oklahoma high school graduates used in this section are based upon information from the Oklahoma State Department of Education and the State Regents for Higher Education. It assumes that demographic trends such as immigration into and emigration out of the state will remain relatively constant.

Graduate enrollment at OSU has remained the same this year and is expected to remain stable for the next several years. Nationally, graduate enrollments have begun to increase due to a weak economy.

In summary, several factors affect enrollment projections at OSU. Some of these factors depend on policy decisions originating with the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and some depend on recruitment policies set by OSU administration. The impact of these policies as well as changing admissions, enrollment, retention, scholarship, and recruiting practices all have a role in determining future enrollment at Oklahoma State University. The Office of Institutional Research will continue to monitor developments in these areas and assess their impact on enrollment.



GLOSSARY

<u>Age</u>

A student's age is computed by subtracting year of birth from 2003. Therefore, students born in January 1978 and December 1978 will both be reported as age 25 (2003-1978).

Classification

Classification describes the student level and/or type and includes freshman, sophomore, junior, senior, special undergraduate, special graduate, master, and doctorate.

College

The University is divided into seven colleges: Agricultural Sciences & Natural Resources (ASNR); Arts & Sciences (A&S); Business Administration (CBA); Education (COE); Engineering, Architecture, & Technology (CEAT); Human Environmental Sciences (HES), and Veterinary Medicine. Data for CEAT are sometimes divided into two data sets—one for Engineering & Architecture (ENGR) and the second for the Division of Technology (TECH).

In addition to these seven colleges, students may enroll in University Academic Services or the Graduate College. In this report, students enrolled in the Graduate College are usually distributed for reporting purposes to the respective college that administers their major coursework.

Ethnicity Codes and Definitions

For purposes of reporting OSU enrollment by ethnicity, the total enrollment at OSU <u>excluding</u> internationals (non-U.S. citizens) is divided into the following categories:

White: All persons having <u>origins</u> in any of the <u>original</u> peoples of Europe (except

Spain and Portugal), North Africa (above the Sahara), or the Middle East. This category would include, for instance: Italy, France, the British Isles, Scandinavia, Germany, Russia, Romania, Greece, Turkey, Morocco, Algeria, Libya, Egypt, Iraq, Israel, Saudi Arabia, and Iran. Any person not claiming an

ethnicity is categorized as white.

African American: All persons having origins in any of the original peoples of Africa south of the

Sahara.

Native American: All persons having origins in any of the original peoples of North or South

America.

Hispanic:

All persons having origins in any of the original peoples of Spain or Portugal.

This category would generally include, for instance: Chicanos, Mexican-Americans, Mexicans, Central and South Americans, Cubans,

Puerto Ricans, Spaniards, and Portuguese.

Asian:

All persons having <u>origins</u> in any of the <u>original</u> peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Pacific Islands. This category would include, for instance: China, Japan, Korea, Thailand, Vietnam, the Philippines, Samoa, Indonesia, New Zealand, Australia, and the Indian subcontinent which

includes all persons from Afghanistan, Nepal, Burma, India, and Pakistan.

In order to present a set of data regarding OSU enrollment that sums to OSU's total enrollment

(including international students), some tables and figures that present data by ethnicity in this

report include an additional column or row of data pertaining to the balance of the student body-

the international student population.

FTE (Full-Time Equivalency)

Full-time equivalent for undergraduate students is 15 hours. For graduate students, a full-time

equivalent is 12 hours. All Veterinary Medicine students are one FTE.

New Freshman

A new freshman is a degree-seeking undergraduate student with fewer than 7 hours of college

credit earned before his/her first semester at OSU. College hours earned through advanced

placement or through concurrent high school enrollment are not figured into the 7 hour limit.

Students who begin as new freshmen during the Summer semester, and continue their

enrollment into the Fall semester, are counted as new freshmen for the Fall. This change begins

with Fall 2003 counts.

Resident Status

A student is categorized as a resident if he or she was a legal resident of the State of Oklahoma at

the time of original admission to OSU. If not a legal resident of Oklahoma at the time of admission,

the student is a nonresident. If the student was a legal resident of a country other than the United States at the time of admission, the student is categorized as an international.

Retention

Student retention is usually expressed as a percentage figure which is derived by comparing the size of a specific group of students who were enrolled at OSU for a given semester to the size of the same group when they are enrolled for a successive given semester.

A non-returning student is defined as a student who was enrolled at OSU for a given semester and who did not graduate and who did not return to OSU for a successive given semester.

Special Undergraduate/Graduate Student

A special undergraduate student is a non-degree-seeking student who has not earned a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university. A special graduate student is a non-degree-seeking student admitted to the Graduate College.

Type of Admission

A new student admitted to OSU is classified as a new freshman, a transfer student, or a readmission. All other students are classified as returning students. A transfer student is classified as such only for the first semester that he attends OSU; after one semester, a transfer student is reclassified as a returning student. Similarly, new freshmen are reclassified as returning students after their first semester at OSU (and are sometimes shown as "other freshmen" when presenting data by classification). A readmission student is a student who has enrolled at OSU in the past but who has not been enrolled at OSU during the previous semester (excluding the summer semester).
